For 27 years of active fandom, starting in 1982. For running conventions and being on fan committees, including the former National Association of Science Fiction. Dan has been a fan writer, artist, editor and publisher. He was one of the South Island's earliest significant fans. (*Abbreviated*)

This year's Sir Julius Vogel Awards were voted on at Conscription, the 2009 New Zealand National Science Fiction Convention, held at the Hotel Grand Chancellor, corner of Kirkbride and Ascot Roads, Mangere, Auckland, NZ over Queen's Birthday Weekend.
