Results for the 2003 Sir Julius Vogel Awards Announced

Monday 21st April, 2003 - The Sir Julius Vogel Awards recognise excellence in Science Fiction, Fantasy and Horror by New Zealanders.

The Sir Julius Vogel Awards are given for work by fans and professionals that was undertaken, completed or released in the year previous to voting. This year the works being voted on were from 2002.

They were voted on by New Zealand fans and were presented at the National Science Fiction convention this year.

The Sir Julius Vogel Awards are administered by SFFANZ, the Science Fiction and Fantasy Association of New Zealand.

This year the National Science Fiction Convention was Emoticon, which took place at Easter, 18th-21st April, 2003 at the Ibis Hotel, Ellerslie, Auckland, New Zealand.
